- 1. I am one of the Plaintiffs in this class action case. I have personal knowledge of the facts stated herein and could testify to these facts under oath.
- 2. I previously filed a declaration on September 15, 2015, in support of Plaintiffs' motion to certify a class in this case and was appointed to serve as a class representative. I am familiar with the Court's Order of January 28, 2016, certifying the Class. I also filed a declaration on February 27, 2023, in support of Plaintiffs' Motion for Preliminary Approval of Second Class Action Settlement, and I am familiar with the Court's Order of March 10, 2023, granting preliminary approval of Second Class Action Settlement.
- 3. I am a member of the litigation Class certified in 2016, and the Settlement Class previously certified by the Court in 2021 as well as the Settlement Class certified in March 2023. In or around 1997, I purchased a CalPERS Long-Term Care Policy with automatic inflation protection and lifetime benefits. I have continuously paid my premiums for the policy to this day.
- 4. In or around February 2013, I received a notice of a rate increase that was to be implemented over a two-year period starting in 2015 and that would increase my premiums by 85%. Because I could not afford to pay the 85% rate increase, I decided in 2015 to reduce my benefits to a 10-year policy with no automatic inflation protection benefits. In or around April or May 2013, my husband and I reached out to counsel, Gretchen Nelson and Stuart Fraenkel, who were recommended to us by a family member. We contacted counsel to see if there was anything that could be done about the 85% rate increase that was announced by CalPERS in 2013.
- 5. I am familiar with all the allegations that have been asserted in this lawsuit and I am familiar with the Court's Orders that have affected the claims and allegations. I have been actively involved in the prosecution of this case from the summer of 2013 when reached out to retain counsel to assist myself and my husband, Richard Lodyga. Richard and I became Plaintiffs in the lawsuit when a First Amended Complaint was filed in December 2013. I have had regular contact with my attorneys regarding the progress of the case.

1	6. I have devoted significant time to gathering essential information for Class
2	Counsel to assist in researching the merits of the claims asserted here. I have been deposed on
3	three separate days in this case (over 30 hours of deposition time and preparation time). I have
4	responded to discovery served on me, including 13 sets of written discovery comprised of 5
5	separate set of interrogatories, 6 separate sets of document requests and 2 separate sets of
6	requests for admission (over 40 hours of time, including gathering hundreds of pages of our own
7	documents for production). In all, my husband and I produced 586 pages of documents that we
8	maintained in our records. In addition, I was asked to and obtained documents from colleagues
9	of mine who also purchased a CalPERS LTC policy. I received regular updates on and followed
10	the status and progress of the lawsuit, spending over 100 hours of time attending the first phase
11	of the trial, hearings on class certification and preliminary and final approval of prior settlements
12	and reviewing documents that have been filed throughout this litigation by our Counsel and
13	opposing counsel, including various orders issued by the Court

7. I have devoted at least 40 hours participating in the mediations that occurred in this case before the Honorable Layn Phillips (Ret.) and the mediation before Nancy Lesser that led to the settlement with the Towers Defendants. I am familiar with the Prior Settlement with CalPERS and filed a declaration in support of the Prior Settlement in July 2021. I participated in numerous settlement discussions since the Prior Settlement was terminated, and I am familiar with the terms of the Second Class Action Settlement. And I have reviewed in detail the Second Class Action Settlement Agreement and Release, which I signed on February 27, 2023.

- 8. From my perspective as a long-time CalPERS policyholder and class member, I believe the Settlement here provides meaningful relief and is a great result for the Class I have worked so hard to represent over the nearly 10 years of this litigation.
- 9. I have been involved in every aspect of this case and by my personal estimate have devoted over 200 hours of time to this litigation as outlined above.
- 10. I am also aware of the extensive work and effort by Class Counsel. Since the inception of this case, Class Counsel have worked tirelessly on behalf of the Class. Class

1	Counsel made certain to provide us with regular updates on the status of the case and made				
2	certain that we were informed of the various orders issued by the Court throughout this litigation.				
3	Class Counsel made certain that we were actively involved in all settlement discussions as well				
4	as motion and trial practice in this case.				
5	11. I am familiar with my responsibilities as a class representative, including my duty				
6	to look out for the interests of other members of the Class and not solely my own. Throughout				
7	my work on this case, I have kept the interests of the Class in mind and sought to do what is in				
8	the best interests of all Class members.				
9	12. I am not aware of any conflicts between myself and any other member of the				
10	proposed Settlement Class or the Class that was previously certified by the Court that would				
11	prevent me from serving as a class representative.
